Senator Claudette Tardif to award Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medals to 20 members of the Franco-Albertan community

Edmonton, September 19, 2012 – The Honourable Claudette Tardif, Senator for Alberta, will present Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medals to 20 outstanding members of Alberta's francophone community. The award ceremony will take place on October 13 at the Timms Centre for the Arts in Edmonton as part of the *Association canadienne-française de l'Alberta's* (ACFA) annual *Gala de reconnaissance*.

On February 6, 2012, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II marked the 60th anniversary of her accession to the throne as Queen of Canada, an event that has occurred only once before, on her great-great-grandmother Queen Victoria's 60th anniversary in 1897. A commemorative medal was created to celebrate the event. The Diamond Jubilee Medal is a visible and tangible way to honour remarkable Canadians of all ages and backgrounds who have made remarkable contributions to their country through service and accomplishment.

As a Senator from Alberta, the Honourable Claudette Tardif was invited by the Governor General of Canada to select candidates from the community for this national honour. The ACFA formed a nomination committee to assist the Senator in selecting a number of recipients. The medal recipients come from across Alberta, and have distinguished themselves by their exemplary contributions in education, arts and culture, immigration and community service.

“It is my great honour and privilege to recognize these individuals for their outstanding and ongoing dedication to the development and vitality of Alberta's francophone communities” said Senator Tardif. “Strong and vibrant communities grow through the sustained efforts of those committed to the vitality of the francophone community in Alberta.”
